## The Education Sub-Committee Meeting of Farm Universities of Karnataka

The Education Sub-Committee Meeting for all Farm Universities of Karnataka took place on  $22^{nd}$  July, 2025 at GKVK, Bengaluru campus presided over by Dr. S.V. Suresha, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of UAS, Bangalore. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss



and take decisions regarding various academic issues that would be presented to the Co-ordination Committee of all the Farm Universities for final approval. The event was honoured by the dignified presence of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellors, Directors of Education, Registrars and Deans from all the Farm Universities of Karnataka who deliberated several important academic issues.

## Memorandum of Agreement with Louis Dreyfus Company

UAS, Bangalore and Louis Dreyfus Company Asia Pvt. Ltd. renewed their existing Memorandum of Agreement on 11<sup>th</sup> July, 2025 for an additional year, extending until 31st August, 2026. This agreement aims to provide scholarships to 15 academically talented students from farming and economically disadvantaged background who are pursuing Under Graduate degree programs at the

## Hands-on-Training on Hydroponics Methods and Techniques

**AICRP ON SEED (CROPS), GKVK** as part of the Soilless Agriculture Project, organised a Hands-on Training Programme on Hydroponic Methods and Techniques from 18<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup> July, 2025 for 37 members representing various parts of Karnataka and beyond. This



initiative equipped aspiring farmers, urban agriculturalists, agri-entrepreneurs and researchers with practical knowledge and live demonstrations of different hydroponic systems. The inaugural ceremony was honoured by the presence of Dr. S.V. Suresha, Vice-Chancellor, who in his motivational speech, underscored the significance of cultivating healthy food within personal living spaces. He encouraged individuals to incorporate garden planning into their home construction projects. He emphasized that, similar to the design of rooms and interiors, it is essential to plan for the cultivation of vegetables and plants. He also commended the University's distinctive Hydroponic and urban garden trainings, which provide tailored layout designs to assist households in growing vegetables, greens and micro greens at home. Dr. H.S. Shivaramu, Director of Research shared valuable insights during the closing ceremony. Dr. K. Madhusudhan, Special Officer (Seeds) and Dr. Vishwanth Koti, Course Director were present.

## Handicrafts from Coconut Shells : Training

ICAR-KVK, TUMAKURU I (Tipaturu) in collaboration with the Shree Kshetra Dharmasthala Rural Development Project (SKDRDP) organised a seven-day practical training programme from 16<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> July, 2025 focused on the creation of handicrafts from coconut shells aimed at empowering women by providing them with skills that can facilitate sustainable income generation. The training emphasized the transformation of discarded coconut shells into aesthetically pleasing and functional handicraft products. Participants received instruction on how to craft a diverse range of items, including flower pots, pen stands, lamp stands, bed lamps, baskets, huts, coffee mugs, wine glasses, spatulas, and various decorative pieces. On the concluding day, an exhibition was organized to display the creations made during the training, highlighting the creativity and dedication of the participants. Certificates were awarded to all women trainees in acknowledgment of their successful completion of the programme. The initiative was well-received and is expected to contribute significantly towards self-employment and economic empowerment of women in the region.

## Raitha Santhe at GKVK Campus

THE DIRECTORATE OF EXTENSION successfully organised 6<sup>th</sup> 'Raitha Santhe' on 26<sup>th</sup> July, 2025 at GKVK campus. This event was designed to inform the general public and the agricultural community about the University's innovations, technologies, and initiatives. During the inauguration of the *Santhe*, Dr. K.C. Narayanaswamy, Registrar, remarked that over time, *Raitha Santhe* has become increasingly significant, evolving



into a dynamic market place for presenting a diverse range of products and technologies developed by the University, KVKs, Agripreneurs and members of SHGs. Notable highlights of the exhibition included eco-friendly products made from cow dung, such as neem powder, paper pulp artefacts, subh-labh nameplates, welcome boards, Ganesh idols, diyas (both floating and decorative), herbal dhoop sticks, mobile stands, bracelets, herbal detergents and more. The *Santhe* drew more than 16,000 visitors, comprising farmers and local residents, with 86 farmers and Self Help Gourps showcasing their products. The event achieved an impressive turnover, exceeding Rs.13.50 lakhs.

#### **Training Programmes by AICRP on WIA**

THE AICRP ON WOMEN IN AGRICULTURE, GKVK conducted a twoday training and method demonstration focused on 'Processing and Value Addition in Tamarind' at Ganada Hunase of Sira taluk, Tumakuru district on 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> July, 2025. Demonstrations included value-added products derived from tamarind, such as paste, candy, juice and pickle, along with suitable packaging and labelling, aimed at fostering entrepreneurial initiatives among farm women. A total of 30 farm women benefitted from this programme. The centre also conducted a one-day training and method demonstration programme at Masthenahalli, Srinivasapura taluk of Kolar district, focusing on the 'Use of Women Friendly Agricultural Tools' on 23<sup>rd</sup> July, 2025.
